Snowmaking

Providing an adequate snow surface, particularly during early season, low snowfall years, and in high traffic locations on the mountain is critical to the guests' experience on the slopes and the success of the resort. Snow grooming works in partnership with snowmaking to assure that a consistent snow surface is available on many of the beginner trails throughout the season as well as on selected intermediate and advanced trails later in the season. Fluctuations in weather patterns from year-to-year have required that snowmaking be an integral part of daily resort operations. Snowmaking is proposed in this MDP for a number of areas to augment the existing system. Table 2.5 identifies the number of acres of snowmaking --existing and proposed--for each individual development opportunity. In addition, those areas are identified in each chapter where it is applicable and illustrated on each individual map.
